# **Programme costs**

The six-day programme will cost 300 USD per applicant.

### The cost includes:

- all tuition and classroom support costs
- accommodation on campus for the duration of the programme
- cultural and social programme
- food during trips which are organised by the University and inclusive in the package

### The cost does not include:

- return ticket to Malaysia
- food (which is very reasonably priced in Malaysia)
- accommodation and transportation for additional stay/excursions
- insurance (students coming from abroad need to sort out their own overseas travel insurance before they leave their home country)

### **Entry requirements**

While no formal academic requirements are necessary, we welcome high school students at Year 12 and above with good English language proficiency of at least IELTS 5.5. You can either be a student from Malaysia or from an international school abroad.

# An international outlook

Nottingham is an international institution with links in business, industry and education that reach around the world. The University has students from over 150 countries and two international campuses, one in China and one in Malaysia. The Malaysia Campus opened in 2000 and became the first branch campus of a British university in Malaysia and one of the first anywhere in the world. Nottingham was also the first foreign university to establish a campus in China when it opened in Ningbo in 2004. Both campuses are integral parts of the University and provide strong links between the UK and Asia.

# The University of Nottingham Malaysia Campus (UNMC)

UNMC is a world-class institution providing a unique opportunity to gain a UK degree whilst studying in Malaysia. It is a full and integral part of The University of Nottingham, UK. All teaching, assessments and examinations are carried out in English.

The campus is a self-contained, self-sufficient village which overlooks scenic green hills. The range of on-campus facilities includes state-ofthe-art laboratories, 24-hour computer access and an extensive library. There is also a book shop, convenience stores and a health centre. The Student Association has an indoor and outdoor food court, as well as social and learning hubs to relax around campus. There are also opportunities to get involved in clubs, societies and a range of activities in our recently refurbished sports centre.

The University is a hive of intellectual and multicultural interaction with around 5,000 students from over 70 countries.

# Our International High School Summer Programme is a unique opportunity for you to gain first-hand experience of university life and teaching and, if you are from outside of Malaysia, the opportunity to learn about a different culture.

### Academic classes

Below is an outline of the classes you will participate in during the summer school. You will take all classes but you don't need prior knowledge of the subjects – the programmes aim to give you a taster and help you choose what subject you might want to study at university or beyond. The interactive classes are taught by experienced academics and you will have the chance to use our state-of-the-art research facilities.

#### Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences

This programme will focus on human rights. As members of common humanity, we all enjoy these to some extent but how we experience them and what we prioritise as human rights varies greatly between different states, societies and cultures. You will be encouraged to explore your own understanding of human rights and investigate the ways in which they are promoted in different contexts.

### **Faculty of Engineering**

The engineering part of the programme looks at how to develop a hovercraft, a machine that is capable of travelling over land, water, mud, ice and other surfaces on a cushion of air. You will learn how the machine is constructed before being put into teams to build and design your very own hovercraft for the grand race finale.

### Faculty of Science

These activities will focus on interactive demonstrations and tours of our state-of-the-art laboratory facilities in subjects including:

- biomedical sciences look at disease under a microscope
- computer science explore how to develop your own app
- geography investigate how to map locations from the sky
- psychology peek into psychology and see what it's like to wear goggles that alter your visual perception!
