



• BN received the most coverage (41.25%), followed by UMNO (7.37%) and PH (6.73%).






• Once parties/coalitions' coverage volumes are combined, BN received the highest level of coverage (57.05%), followed by PH (16.37%) and GS (24.23%).

• The Neutral tone was used the most (70%), followed by Positive (14%) and Attacked (12%).




Figure 4.1: Attacked Political Party & Coalition Coverage 0.00 STAR USNO 0.00 LDP 0.00 0.00 Other AMANAH 0.00 UPKO 0.00 0.00 UMNO SUPP 0.00 0.00 SAPP PSM 0.00 PRM 0.00 0.00 PRS PPBM 0.00 PDP 0.00 0.00 PCM PBS 0.00 0.00 PBRS 0.00 PBB 0.00 MIC 0.00 MCA IKATAN 0.00 Gerakan 0.00 Gagasan Sejahtera 0.00 PAS 0.86 ΒN 1.29 PKR 2.16 Warisan 3.88 ΡH 5.17 DAP 13.36 2.00 6.00 8.00 0.00 4.00 10.00 12.00 14.00 16.00




Figure 4.2: Negative Political Party & Coalition Coverage

• BN received the most positive coverage (70.70%), followed by PH (8.42%) and UMNO (4.76%).







Figure 5.2: Neutral Political Party & Coalition Coverage

• BN received the most Neutral coverage (43.13%), followed by UMNO (9.26 %) and PKR (8.05%).









• Overall BN received the most coverage for all the tones.




Section 2: Coverage of Politicians and Political Figures

- Out of these 5, Mahathir Mohamad received the most mentions by a significant proportion (17.98%), followed by Najib Razak (12.60%).


Figure 8: Volume of Coverage of Politicians & Political Figures: Government vs. Opposition vs. Independent/Other




2.2 Volume of the Use of Politicians & Political Figures as Sources Figure 9: Volume of the Use of Politicians & Political Figures as Sources

Figure 10: Volume of the Use of Politicians & Political Figures As Sources: Government vs. Opposition vs. Independent/Other






• Of all the tonal categories used in the coverage of politicians and political figures, the positive category was used the most often (70%), followed by the positive category (14%).

Figure 12.1: Negative Coverage of Politicians & Political Figures





• In terms of the tone of mentions of politicians and political figures, Najib Razak received the most positive coverage (26.14%) followed by Mahathir Mohamad who received the second highest positive coverage (24.84%).





Figure 13.2: Neutral Coverage of Politicians & Political Figures

• Najib Razak received the most neutral coverage (11.03%) followed by Mahathir Mohamad (9.67%).









Overall, PH received the highest attacked and negative coverage. Independent/ Others parties received the highest neutral coverage and whereas BN received the most positive coverage.

Figure 15: Attack Politics: Which Politicians and Political Figures Employ 'Attack Politics' Most Often?




- This graph is weighted to show attack politics as a proportion of overall use as source.
- Najib Razak was the politicians most likely to engage in attack politics (63.66%), followed by Ahmad Zahid Hamidi (14.71%).




- This graph is weighted to show attack politics as a proportion of overall use as source.
- Overall, BN (65%) coalition politicians engaged in attack politics more often than Independent/ Others parties (29%).








Note: Non-policy issues received more coverage than Policy issues.

Note: BN Manifesto received the most coverage, followed by PH Manifesto. Gagasan Manifesto received the least coverage of the three sides.





Figure 18.2: Breakdown of Economy/Development Issues





Figure 19.1: Breakdown of Socioeconomic Sectors
