

Section 1: Coverage of Political Parties and Coalitions


**1.1 Volume of Coverage of Parties & Coalitions** Figure 1: Volume of Coverage of Political Parties & Coalitions



• BN received the most coverage (21.42%), followed by PH (17.09%) and UMNO (10.79%).








• Once parties/coalitions' coverage volumes are combined, PH received the highest level of coverage (44.45%), followed by BN (42.81%) and GS (11.29%).

### **1.2 Tone of Coverage of Political Parties & Coalitions**


Figure 3: Raw Tonal Coverage Volume of Political Parties & Coalitions



• The Neutral tone was used the most (86%), followed by Negative (7%) and Positive (6%)



#### Figure 4.1: Attacked Political Party & Coalition Coverage




• DAP received the most Attacked coverage (21.43 %).

• BN and PH received equal amounts of Attacked coverage (18.37%).




#### Figure 4.2: Negative Political Party & Coalition Coverage



• BN received the most Negative coverage (28.68%), followed by UMNO (15.44%) and DAP (12.50%).




Figure 5.1: Positive Political Party & Coalition Coverage



• BN received the most positive coverage (38.24%), followed by PH (13.24%) and UMNO (8.82%).




Figure 5.2: Neutral Political Party & Coalition Coverage



• BN received the most Neutral coverage (21.84%), followed by PH (17.93%) and UMNO (10.83%).









• PH received the most Neutral, Negative, and Attacked coverage, while BN received the most Positive coverage.




Section 2: Coverage of Politicians and Political Figures





- Only the top 5 most mentioned politicians are shown on this graph.
- Out of these 5, Mahathir Mohamad received the most mentions by a significant proportion (9.67%), followed by Najib Razak (8.07%).


Figure 8: Volume of Coverage of Politicians & Political Figures: Government vs. Opposition vs. Independent/Other



- When the mentions of individual politicians and political figures are combined and merged into their respective coalitions, we can see that coverage of figures from both major coalitions is skewed towards Independent/ Others (60%).
- There was more coverage of PH compared to BN.









- Only the top 5 most mentioned politicians are shown on this graph.
- Out of these 5, Mahathir Mohamad received the most coverage (9.49%), followed by Najib Razak (7.60%).

Figure 10: Volume of the Use of Politicians & Political Figures As Sources: Government vs. Opposition vs. Independent/Other



 When the mentions of individual politicians and political figures are combined and merged into their respective coalitions, we can see that coverage of figures from both major coalitions is skewed towards Independent/ Others (62%). PH received more coverage than BN.



• Of all the tonal categories used in the coverage of politicians and political figures, the neutral category was used the most often (88%), followed by the negative category (5%).






Figure 12.1: Negative Coverage of Politicians & Political Figures

• In terms of the tone of mentions of politicians and political figures, Najib Razak received the highest negative coverage (17.54%), followed by Mahathir Mohamad (10.96%).







• Najib Razak was attacked the most (16.84%), followed by Mahathir Mohamad (14.74%).






Figure 13.1: Positive Coverage of Politicians & Political Figures








• Mahathir Mohamad received the most neutral coverage (9.08%), followed by Najib Razak (6.96%).








Overall, Independent/Others received the highest coverage across the three tones of Neutral, Positive, and Negative. There were no Attacked tones recorded.

# **2.4** Tone of the Use of Politicians & Political Figures As Sources: Attack Politics or Negative Campaigning


Figure 15: Attack Politics: Which Politicians and Political Figures Employ 'Attack Politics' Most Often?



- This graph is weighted to show attack politics as a proportion of overall use as source.
- Mahathir Mohamad was the politician most likely to engage in attack politics (10.07%), followed by Najib Razak (9.72%).




Figure 16: Attack Politics: Which Coalition Employs Attack Politics Most Often?




- This graph is weighted to show attack politics as a proportion of overall use as source.
- Overall, Independent/ Others party politicians engaged in attack politics most often (63%), followed by PH (19%) and BN (15%).




Section 3: Coverage of Issues






Note: Non-policy issues were reported on a lot more than Policy issues.

Note: BN Manifesto was the most covered, followed by PH Manifesto. No coverage was given to Gagasan Manifesto.





Figure 18.2: Breakdown of Economy/Development Issues





Figure 19.1: Breakdown of Socioeconomic Sectors
