


1.1 Volume of Coverage of Parties & Coalitions Figure 1: Volume of Coverage of Political Parties & Coalitions



• BN received the most coverage (24.05%), followed by Warisan (11.71%) and DAP (9.52%).








• Once parties/coalitions' coverage volumes are combined, BN received the highest level of coverage (52.06%), followed by PH (43.17%) and GS (1.73%).

1.2 Tone of Coverage of Political Parties & Coalitions


Figure 3: Raw Tonal Coverage Volume of Political Parties & Coalitions



• The Neutral tone was used the most (48%), followed by Positive (29%) and Negative (21%).




Figure 4.1: Attacked Political Party & Coalition Coverage



• Warisan received the most Attacked coverage (24.62%), followed by DAP (16.92%) and BN (15.38%).




Figure 4.2: Negative Political Party & Coalition Coverage



• BN received the most Negative coverage (32.04%), followed by DAP and UMNO (7.55%).




Figure 5.1: Positive Political Party & Coalition Coverage



• BN received the most positive coverage (29.10%), followed by Warisan (12.84%) and PH (9.55%).




Figure 5.2: Neutral Political Party & Coalition Coverage



• BN received the most Neutral coverage (18.83%) followed by Warisan (12.64%) and DAP (10.61%).




Figure 6: Tone of Coverage of Political Parties & Coalitions: Government vs. Opposition vs. Independent/Other




• PH received the most Attacked and Neutral coverage, while BN received the most Positive and Negative coverage.




Section 2: Coverage of Politicians and Political Figures





- Only the top 5 most mentioned politicians are shown on this graph.
- Out of these 5, Shafie Apdal received the most mentions by a significant proportion (8.69%), followed by Musa Aman (5.70%).


Figure 8: Volume of Coverage of Politicians & Political Figures: Government vs.Opposition vs. Independent/Other



- When the mentions of individual politicians and political figures are combined and merged into their respective coalitions, we can see that coverage of figures is skewed towards Independent/ Others (67%).
- There was more coverage of PH compared to BN.




2.2 Volume of the Use of Politicians & Political Figures as Sources Figure 9: Volume of the Use of Politicians & Political Figures as Sources

- Out of these 5, Shafie Apdal received the most coverage (10.00%), followed by Musa Aman (9.29%).


Figure 10: Volume of the Use of Politicians & Political Figures As Sources: Government vs. Opposition vs. Independent/Other







2.3 Tone of Coverage of Politicians & Political Figures

• In terms of the tone of mentions of politicians and political figures, Musa Aman received the highest negative coverage (14.29%), followed by Mahathir Mohamad (11.43%).






Figure 12.2: Attacked Coverage of Politicians & Political Figures

• Shafie Apdal was attacked the most (40.40%), followed by Ahmad Zahid Hamidi (9.09%).













Overall, Independent/Others received the highest Positive, Neutral, and Negative coverage, while PH received the highest Attacked coverage.

- Yong Teck Lee was the politician most likely to engage in attack politics (20.48%), followed by Musa Aman (14.46%).





- Overall, Independent/ Others party politicians engaged in attack politics most often (47%), followed by BN (37%) and PH (15%).





3.1. Volume of Media Coverage of Policy Issues vs Non-Policy Issues Figure 17: Coverage of Policy vs Non-Policy Issues




Note: Non-policy issues received more coverage than Policy issues.

Figure 18: Policy Issues




Note: Economy/Development was the most covered issue, followed by Education and Vision.




Note: BN manifesto was covered far more than the others, followed by PH manifesto. No coverage of Gagasan Manifesto.

Note: Territory was the most covered topic, followed by Ethnicity and Electioneering.





Figure 19.1: Breakdown of Socioeconomic Sectors
