A Symbol of Identity and Heritage: The University of Nottingham Malaysia Mace

As the University of Nottingham Malaysia (UNM) celebrates 25 years of excellence in education, research, and impact, it proudly unveils its own ceremonial University Mace. The Mace is a symbol of academic authority and institutional identity, crafted to reflect both its British roots and its distinct Malaysian context.

Modelled after the original 1949 Mace of the University of Nottingham, UK, the UNM Mace shares its foundational form but incorporates unique local elements that honour the campus's journey, cultural heritage, and contributions to Malaysian higher education since its establishment in 2000.



A Shared Foundation, A Local Story

The UNM Mace retains the overall structure of the original Mace, including the crown, shaft, and hexagonal head. However, where the design truly comes to life is in its thoughtful adaptations that represent the Malaysian campus and the country it calls home.

On the head of the Mace, one of the four main panels continues to feature the Coat of Arms of the University of Nottingham. The remaining three panels have been updated to reflect the identity of the Malaysian campus, ensuring that Nottingham's presence in Malaysia is proudly represented in its ceremonial emblem.

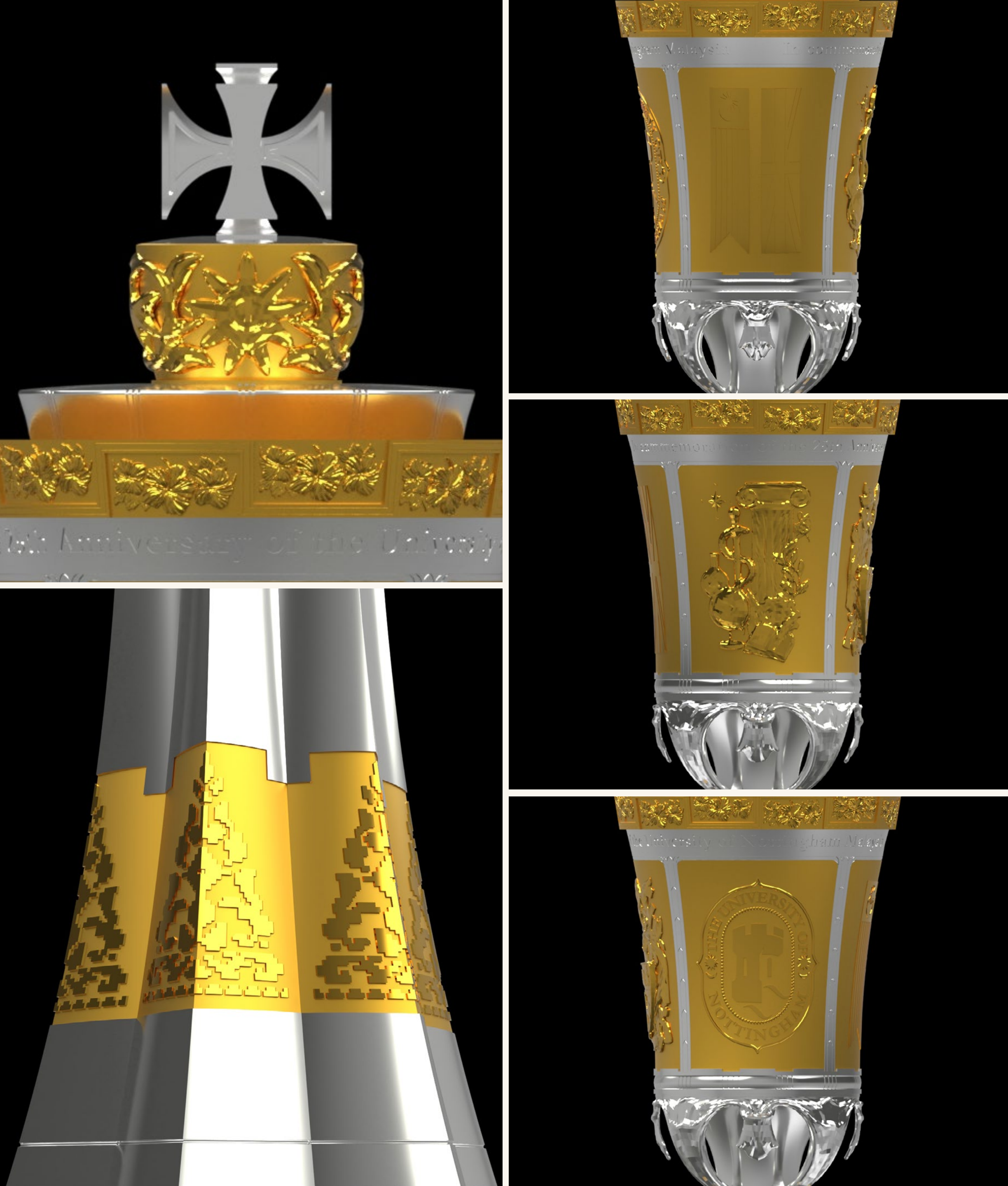
The traditional oak leaf decorations have been reinterpreted using Malaysia's national flower, the Bunga Raya (hibiscus flower). It also includes the Bunga Tanjung Pecah Sembilan, the official flower of the state of Selangor, where the Semenyih campus is located. These native floral motifs celebrate UNM's place within the Malaysian landscape and the community it serves.

Symbolism in Every Detail

The shaft and crown of the Mace remain unchanged, preserving the integrity of the original design. However, the central knop has been adapted with a Malaysian wood-carving motif, representing the rich artisan heritage of the region and the deep-rooted values of craftsmanship and tradition.

The base, originally adorned with oak leaf clusters, now features a pucuk rebung (bamboo shoot) motif - a symbol in Malaysian culture representing growth, resilience, and hope. This motif is especially fitting for a university that continues to nurture generations of students to thrive and lead.

At the bottom of the base, the original reverse 'N' cypher is retained, visually connecting the Mace to the larger Nottingham identity. However, the inscription has been updated to mark the year 2000, commemorating the founding of the University of Nottingham Malaysia.





Crafted to Inspire

Much more than a ceremonial object, the UNM Mace is a symbol of the university's evolution. From its pioneering beginnings as the first British university branch campus in Malaysia, to its current standing as a leading global institution deeply rooted in Southeast Asia.

The Mace will serve as a centrepiece during formal university occasions, including graduations and special commemorative events, standing as a tangible reminder of the university's legacy and values.

In bringing together elements of the past, present, and future, the University of Nottingham Malaysia Mace embodies everything the institution stands for: academic excellence, cultural respect, community impact, and a deep commitment to shaping future generations.

Academic dress: A brief history

Academic dress has a rich history, evolving from its practical origins to becoming a symbol of achievement and distinction. In the past, hoods were used to cover the head and varied in lining materials based on the season.

Today, the colours and styles of hoods and gowns serve as a visual representation of different levels and subject areas of awards. The colours and styles vary depending on the institution. Since its establishment in 1948, Nottingham has used light blue as its degree colour.





Academic dress

Gowns

Gowns for first and masters degrees are black.

Gowns for doctors are claret, faced to a depth of 3" with light blue silk.

Gowns for higher doctors are scarlet, faced to a depth of 3" with light blue silk.

Hoods

Students receiving a certificate wear hoods in the Belfast shape.

Students receiving a diploma wear hoods in the Edinburgh shape.

Students receiving a degree at any level wear hoods in the Cambridge shape.

All graduate hoods are bound at the edge with a ribbon of the colour appropriate to the nominal faculty. For higher first and higher masters degrees, the entire hood – including the cape – is bound with ribbon.

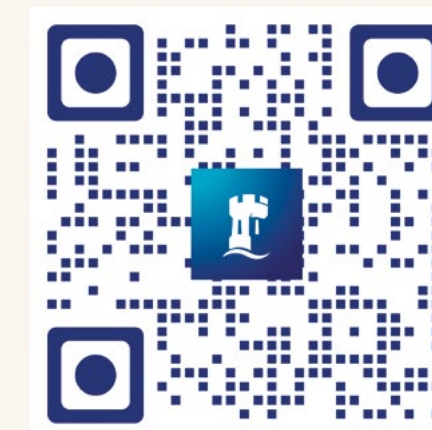

As the Managing Director of William Teo & Associates and the Country Director for the World Institute for Action Learning (WIAL) Malaysia, he has become a leading voice in fostering collaborative problem-solving and organisational growth across Asia.

Mr. Teo has been instrumental in championing Action Learning, a dynamic process where small groups work on real-world challenges to improve performance. Through his leadership at WIAL Malaysia, he has cultivated a thriving community of practice, training and certifying countless professionals, which has enhanced leadership and problem-solving capabilities within major corporations and institutions. His expertise is sought after internationally, with consultancy and training engagements taking him to Singapore, India, the Philippines, and Vietnam, reflecting his global impact on professional development.

A proud alumnus of the University of Nottingham Malaysia, Mr. Teo was a member of the inaugural 2006 cohort for the MSc in Management Psychology programme, graduating in 2010. He has since become a dedicated and active ambassador for the Malaysia Campus. His contributions are extensive and impactful as he generously provides scholarships for WIAL certification to University staff and fellow alumni, frequently delivers inspiring guest lectures and career talks, and offers invaluable one-on-one coaching and mentorship to students. This direct engagement provides students with practical wisdom and a tangible connection to the professional world. Furthermore, his strategic insights as a member of the Industry Advisory Board for the Institute of Work, Organisation and Wellbeing are vital in aligning the University's programmes with evolving industry demands, ensuring graduates are exceptionally well-prepared for their careers.

Honorary Graduates

Jochebed Isaacs

Jochebed Isaacs is the Director of Early Autism Project (EAP) Malaysia and a Clinical Psychologist with over 20 years of experience in the field of autism. She holds a Master of Clinical Psychology from Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia and a Bachelor of Psychology from Curtin University of Technology. Under her leadership, EAP has supported over 1,000 autistic children from more than 30 countries, with nearly half (who receive full time hours at a young age) successfully closing their developmental gaps.

Trained at the Wisconsin Early Autism Project under Dr Glen Sallows, Jochebed has worked across Malaysia, the United States, Australia, and Singapore. Her contributions include conducting diagnostic evaluations and developmental assessments, and training parents, therapists, and professionals in both clinical and leadership areas.

In 2016, she launched *The Hope Project* (THP), EAP's non-profit arm. THP has since delivered 93 autism awareness campaigns, 70 school-based kindness campaigns, and nine advocacy videos, alongside providing scholarships, pro-bono training, and support for five non-profit centres. Its online content has garnered over one million views.

She further expanded this work with the launch of *Autism at Home* in 2020 — an online portal offering over 200 videos across 30 English-language series and an upcoming five-part Bahasa Malaysia series, accessible via a nominal monthly donation. THP has also established a subsidised therapy unit with HELP University and is now supporting additional needs students at the Dignity for Children Foundation.

In 2024, EAP became a certified QABA coursework provider. In 2025, it received a grant from Yayasan Sime Darby and the Ministry of Finance to train 200 teachers in ABA techniques. Jochebed's team also developed an internal app to extend EAP's technological outreach.

Under her guidance, EAP built a strong partnership with the University of Nottingham Malaysia, offering internships to psychology students and facilitating knowledge exchange between EAP professionals and UNM academics.

Her advocacy has gained national recognition, with media appearances on NTV7, Bernama, BFM, and features in *The Star*, *NST*, *Berita Harian*, and more. Through unwavering commitment and innovative initiatives, Jochebed Isaacs continues to shape a more inclusive and supportive landscape for autistic individuals in Malaysia and beyond.

Jochebed receives the degree of Doctor of Laws, *honoris causa*, for her outstanding accomplishments.

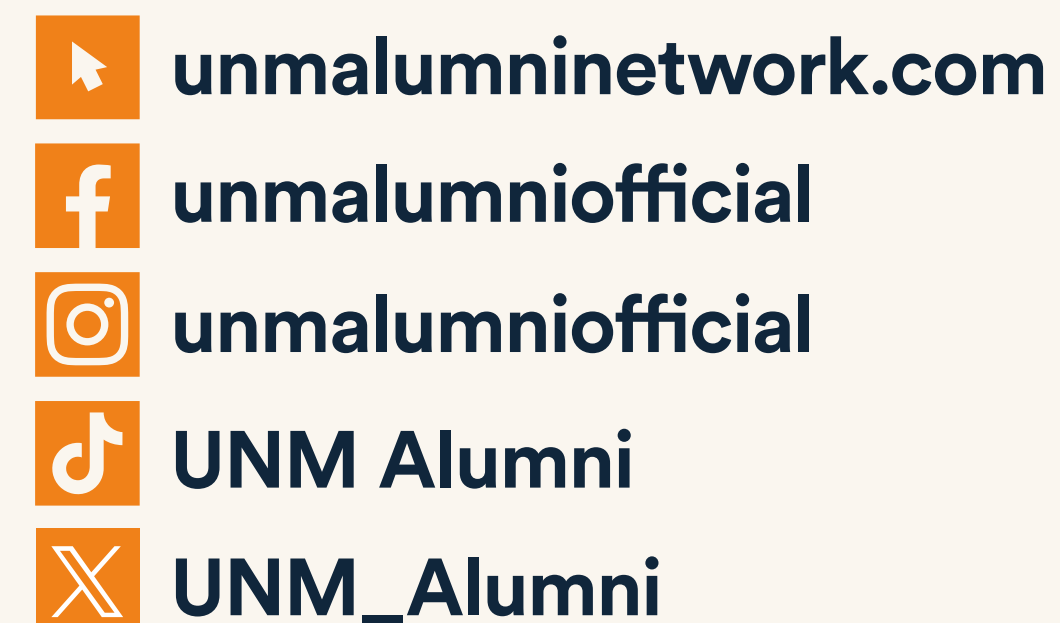

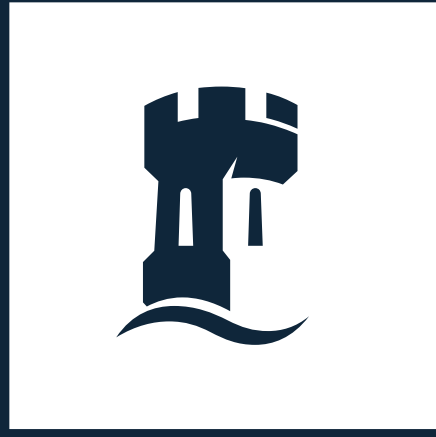
