Abstract:

What is the role of schooling for displaced people; does it have the same or a different function than national systems of schooling? In adapting a social-anthropological approach, the researcher is investigating as part of a PhD thesis the role that schooling (learning centres) plays for displaced and refugee communities in Malaysia. Without access to state schooling, many communities have formed their own centres that are ethnically, religiously, linguistically and nationally focused. In researching these communities, early analysis suggests that the learning centres facilitate five areas: preparedness, maintenance, socialisation, well-being, and agency. The presentation will discuss how communities come together to provide for one another in order to address their needs and aspirations.
